Entry Information

DNA/Microchip - All dogs entered in the 2019 ISCA National Championship, National Amateur Championship, and ISCA Futurity must have a DNA profile from AKC and must be microchipped. Normal processing time for a DNA profile is 6 to 8 weeks. An entry will not be drawn unless the DNA Profile number and microchip number is submitted with entry or is in the database. The DNA and microchip information is retained from year to year. If you have previously supplied this information, it does not need to be resubmitted with your entries. If in doubt, please contact Vickie Tompkins by E-Mail NapaRedDog@aol.com or by cell phone (707) 486-5513. DNA and/or microchip information can be mailed to the Field Trial Secretary prior to submitting entries. Please write your dog's microchip number on the AKC DNA profile.

The National Championship and The National Amateur Championship stakes will be run as "Grand" stakes and are open to any AKC Registered Irish Setter six months of age or over that has placed 1st, 2nd, 3rd, or 4th in an Open or Amateur Gun Dog, Limited Gun Dog or All Age stake, at an AKC Licensed or AKC Member Field Trial **prior to close of entries on October 14, 2019.**

Open Derby Classic - Open to Irish Setters Only and limited to the number of dogs that can be run in daylight hours on Sunday, October 27, 2019.

Open Gun Dog – We will offer a 30 minute Open Gun Dog stake open to Irish Setters only. It is our hope to attract Irish Setters not yet qualified for the Championship stakes or not quite ready for 60 minutes. **It will be limited to 12 dogs** and run on the Championship courses.

ISCA Futurity – Open to properly nominated Irish Setters of current ISCA members.

BITCHES IN SEASON may compete in all stakes.

Tracking Collars - AKC approved Tracking Collars will be allowed in all stakes. The Owner/Handler is responsible for providing the tracking collar.

Entries will open on September 14, 2019 at 9:00 AM (PST). Entries will be accepted via mail or E-Mail. **All entry fees must be paid prior to the start of the event on October 27, 2019.** E-Mail entries to NapaRedDog@aol.com and indicate "ISCA 2019 NFT" in the subject line of your E-Mail. I will confirm receipt of your E-Mail entry. If you do not receive a confirmation of your entry, please E-Mail or call me.

Grounds/Facilities

We will return to the Blue Mountain Special Use Area near Booneville, Arkansas where we have successfully run our event for the past 20+ years. For those not familiar with the area, the grounds are divided into three 1-hour courses with a strong native quail population and are some of the finest field trial grounds in our nation where Gun Dogs and All Age Dogs alike can show off their abilities. The clubhouse with full kitchen facilities is the gathering point for hospitality, fellowship and great food prepared for breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Depending on entries, we plan to begin with breakfast on Sunday, Oct. 27th and end with lunch on Sunday, Nov. 6th.

IMPORTANT NOTES - After discussion last year, the Executive Committee clarified the following:

Horse Stalls/Paddocks: There are box and stand-up stalls in the barn as well as outdoor horse pens. Indoor box stalls and stand-up stalls are for one horse per stall. Outdoor pens are for a minimum of two horses per pen. Anne Eichenberger will reserve pens/stalls for Judges and key committee personnel only. All other horse stalls and pens will be on a first come/first serve basis for your own use. You may NOT reserve or hold stalls and/or paddocks for those arriving later than you. A concrete wash area for horses is located at the end of the indoor horse stalls adjacent to the first row of dog kennels.

Dog Kennels: Chain link dog kennels with plastic barrels are available for our use. There will be kennels available for bitches in season. Owners will be responsible for bitches in season at their campsites. Bitches in season need to be kept

RV Pads: RV pads with electrical hookups are available as well as shower facilities and a meeting room in the clubhouse. Due to limited availability of RV asphalt pads, they are for those staying in their rigs on the grounds. Anne Eichenberger will coordinate the pads reserved for Judges and key committee personnel. All other RV asphalt pads will be on a first come/first served basis for your own personal use. There will be no reserving in advance for others arriving later than you. Across the road from the clubhouse is an additional camping area with shower and laundry facilities. Fees are as follows:

RV Pads (asphalt): \$20.00 per day
RV Pads (non-asphalt): \$10.00 per day
Inside Horse Box Stalls: \$10.00 per day (1 horse per stall)
Inside Stand Stalls: \$1.00 per day
Outside Paddocks (small or large): \$5.00 per horse per day
Dog Kennels: \$1.00 per dog, per day
Across the Road Camping - \$7.00 per rig per day

All revenues collected at the event are used for funding our National Field Trial Championship event except the across the road camping which is paid to the Brittany Club.

Animal Requirements

A valid Negative Coggins is required on all horses!!! Please do not unload your horses on the grounds until the Coggins certificate has been checked by Anne Eichenberger. This is a State of Arkansas requirement for our club and there will be NO EXCEPTIONS!

Proof of current rabies vaccinations should be available on all dogs brought onto the grounds. If your bitch is in season, or comes in season, please advise the Field Trial Secretary as soon as possible so that bracing changes can be done and posted in the clubhouse. Please load bitches in season in the designated dog boxes at the back of the dog wagon only.

Horse Rentals

Terry Zygalski of Gaited Pleasure Horses will once again serve as our wrangler. Full Day rentals will be \$130.00/per horse and half-day rentals will be \$70.00/per horse for advance reservations. A Horse Reservation Form with the Liability Release will be included with the premium and also posted on the ISCA website.

There will be a limited number of horses available. Advance reservations are strongly suggested and can be made with the Field Trial Secretary, Vickie Tompkins or with Terry Zygalski. If you make reservations directly with Terry, please also call or E-Mail the information to the Field Trial Secretary. You can also mail your horse reservations in with your entries.
